

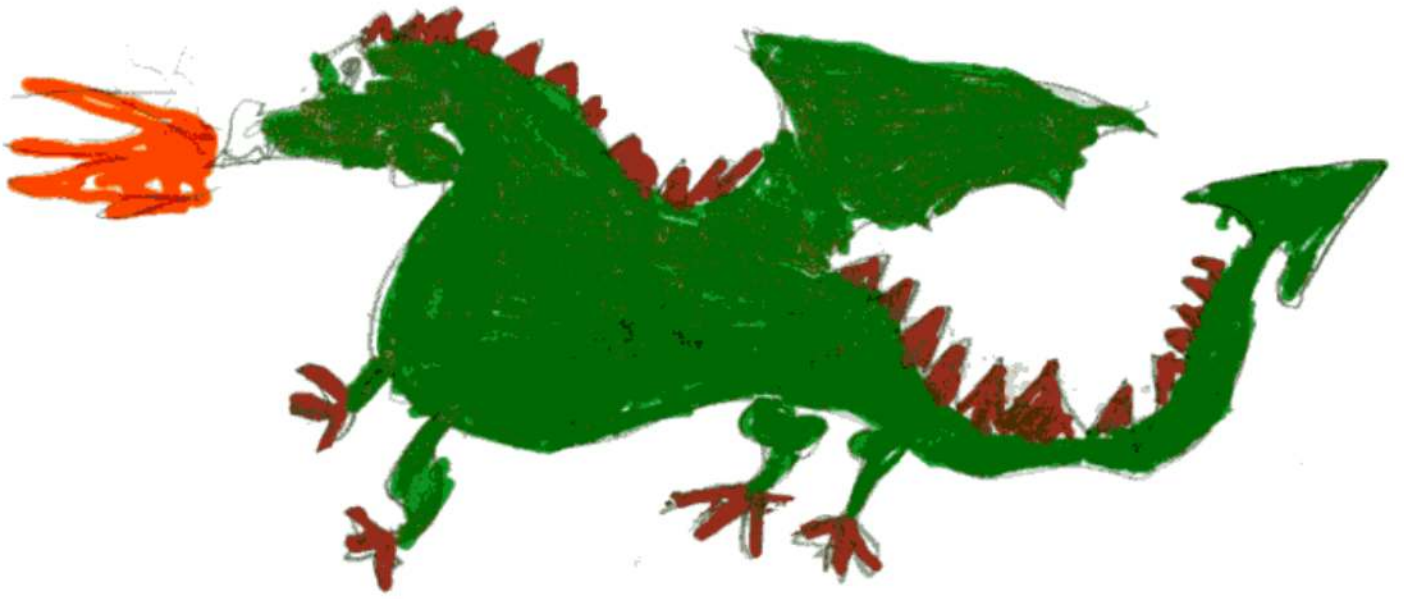
Book Report of How to Twist a Dragons Tale By Christopher
