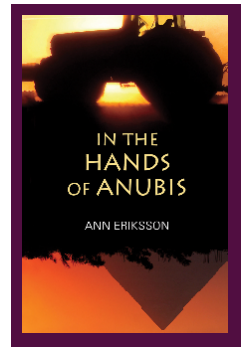

In the Hands of Anubis brings together an unusual set of characters — Trevor Wallace, an introverted tractor salesman with a lost childhood and Constance Ebenezer, an eccentric woman in her seventies, who is travelling the world with extraordinary contraband in her luggage—the ashes of her three dead husbands. The two are marooned briefly in Cairo, just long enough for Trevor's world to begin unraveling.
